TAB -> CAB:

It was brought up about limited posting on twitter. In the past the official Bioconductor twitter account posted only new packages, conference announcements, release announcements, and nomination announcements.

- Concern that colleagues not on Bluesky can also be informed. My experience
 posting on both twitter and bluesy is that twitter has a wider and more diverse
 reach.
- Concern over bullying: it is creeping into Bluesky now too and individuals on the call have experienced it so it is not limited to Twitter. Some think it should influence our decision on where to post.
- The reasons not to post seem like a political statement. I (referring to the person suggesting it) prefer to stay out of politics. Posting software updates on Twitter helps our project and our users
- Alternative POV: My 2 cents would be that the problem with X is not just anecdotal bullying by one person, but a pattern of the platform amplifying some voices (racists, neofascists, etc) while silencing other views (feminists, anti-racist organizers, etc...), which has led to an exodus of the latter from the platform, and thus created the impression that anyone who remains is supportive, or at the very least complicit by indifference, of those taking over the platform. That being said, I do agree it's a largely US-centric shift, as most of the world doesn't change their apps based on what US oligarch owns it... Every platform will always have all kinds of people, by the nature of how social media works, but I would not dismiss concerns about X as just anecdotal. One potential way to possibly accomplish both, i.e. both reach the international people that are still only on X, while not compromising project values: what if we have a bot that reposts Bluesky to X automatically. I.e. no engagement, just posting, so that we continue to protect the community from dealing with the toxicity, and encourage folks to join BlueSky or other platforms to truly engage with Bioconductor, but we still have a bot that autoposts passively
